This email is to update SVCS Parents and Guardians about the fear of the Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) in Schools.

According to the City of West Sacramento, “there have been NO confirmed cases of Novel Coronavirus (COVID-2019) in West Sacramento or Yolo County.”

“The City of West Sacramento and the Washington Unified School District are in regular communication with the Yolo County Health Department who advise that students, staff and community members should continue their normal activities and take the same precautions they would during cold and flu season.”

SVCS is constantly in contact with Yolo County Public Health Department and the West Sacramento City Public Health Department. Currently there are no immediate threats of the Coronavirus in Yolo County.

To make it clear, one confirmed case from Solano County is being treated at UC Medical Center in Sacramento not in Yolo County. The student from UC Davis who was being tested for COVID-19 came back negative on 2/29/20. This student and the other two UC Davis students have been released.
