Dear Parents,

Everyone is anxious to know how long COVID-19 will remain dangerous to our safety and health. We have been witnessing the occasional rise and fall in cases over the past months. Currently, the good news is that we are noticing a downward trend in Yolo and Sacramento counties. Both counties are in the red tier which means the threat of the virus is still substantial. School Boards are monitoring the situation, as the flu season is around the corner and it is going to be difficult to differentiate between the flu and the Coronavirus. If the downward trend continues for the month of October and November, we hope to implement the next phase of the school reopening plan. But it entirely depends on the directions from the CDC, Yolo and Sacramento counties' public health departments.

In the meanwhile, please observe all the precautions such as wearing a mask, social distancing, washing your hands frequently, and avoiding crowded places. [The most common symptoms of COVID-19](#) are shortness of breath, fever, dry coughs, headache, fatigue, runny and stuffy nose. If you notice any of these symptoms, please get yourself tested. This is how we can stop the spread of this virus in our communities.

Parents' involvement in their scholar's education has multiple advantages. It keeps them academically motivated, emotionally secure, and socially well-adjusted. Your minimum investment of time in your child's education has a lifetime benefit. The first trimester is ending on November 6, and you will get a report card of your scholar. Parent-teacher conferences will take place, November 12-13, with your scholar's teachers. Please make sure you do not miss meeting your scholar's teacher. We appreciate you for your role in making Distance Learning a success. Scholars get ready for online school in the same way as they would for a regular school. The credit of it entirely goes to you. **CDE Film Contest:** The California Department of Education (CDE) is pleased to continue supporting the annual Directing Change Program and Film Contest. This statewide program invites California students from grades seven through twelve to create 60-second films about suicide prevention, mental health, and related cultural perspectives. Schools that participate in the program are eligible to receive mental health and suicide prevention resources. Schools associated with the first-place winning film in each category, in each region, are eligible to receive \$500 to support suicide prevention and mental health awareness programs and activities at their school.
