Thank you SVCS parents for your cooperation in sending your scholar daily to school. We want them happy and engaged. Their exposure to unhealthy and abusive circumstances can make them sad at school. Please make your child's social and emotional well-being a priority.

In the past few weeks of school, we have been working hard to identify the individual learning needs of your scholars. Everyday our teachers observe how your child learns in the classroom and how he/she completes homework and other assignments. Our efforts won't bear fruit if your involvement in your child's education is minimal. Please set a regular routine for schoolwork. Set a study space that is fully lit and free from any distractions. Limiting your scholar's screen time is very important. Let it be no more than 1 hour of TV, Video games, and online activities. If your scholars must use a computer for school assignments, please monitor their online activities. Make sure they know what is safe to watch, read, and listen according to their age. Please set rules and expectations for behavior that makes one successful in life.

We have scheduled parent-teacher conferences for November 16 and 17. There is no school for scholars on these two days. It is very important to attend these conferences. Your involvement positively impacts your child's achievements. Sending your scholar to school every day, making sure they read 30 minutes aloud, and checking if they completed their homework are some of the steps that help build strong academic skills. The first trimester is ending on November 9; we will mail report cards home then. Scholars with high grade point averages can get Honor Roll and Principal Honor Roll besides other achievement awards.

National Bullying Prevention Month: Bullying can harm the emotional and mental health of our scholars if not checked in the beginning of the school year. Let's instill confidence in our scholars so that they come forward to report it. We must make bullies accountable and ashamed of their actions. Only our joint efforts can stop this practice. Bullying can happen both in person or online. Cyberbullying often occurs over social media, SMS/text or instant message, email, or any online platform where children interact. Show your child how to treat other children and adults with kindness and respect by doing the same to the people around you, including speaking up when others are being mistreated. Children look to their parents as examples of how to behave, including what to post online.

**Bus Privileges, Expectations and Rules:** We provide transportation to our scholars at highly subsidized rates. We don't want scholars to use the bus privilege to harm and hurt others. Students are assigned seats in the bus. They are expected to sit with a seatbelt on and to stay within their seat throughout the entire journey. They can't extend their arms outside of the window at any time. Students are not allowed to bully or touch other students. There are no foods and drinks allowed on vans/buses.

We don't allow expensive items such as jewelry, toys, Ipads, iphone, or any other personal property not required by the school. If these items are brought to school, they will be confiscated. This is an opportunity for parents to limit the data on their student's phones or put some parental controls in place. We need your help to monitor your child's electronic behavior because if they are left unmonitored, it may lead to bullying. We have a no tolerance policy for bullying. That sort of behavior will lead to losing privileges.

Picture Day: Makeup day will be November 1, 2023. Parents are encouraged to follow the link from the email that Lifetouch sent you in order to pay for your scholar's picture package; this is the most convenient way to pay as it does not require exact change or use of a check. Student's must be in uniform

CAASPP Testing: We have tested our scholars for the CAASPP Interim testing. We will communicate with parents once results are in.

Halloween Parade: On October 31st your scholars are encouraged to wear their Halloween costumes. We do have some requirements. Please do not allow them to wear full face masks, face makeup, or anything violent. Please do not allow them to bring anything that looks like a weapon with them to school. No sharp objects are allowed.
