

Dear Sacramento Valley Charter School Stakeholders:

The Board is thrilled to share that Dr. Brown will be starting in her position as SVCS Principal beginning next week. Dr. Brown was selected to serve as SVCS Principal and assist our school through an important transition period as we change leadership and expand our educational program to include TK.

We understand that community members have questions and concerns about the change in leadership of SVCS. The Board urges SVCS community members to be aware that many false rumors and information are circulating at this time. Please understand that the Board is unable to comment in detail on the reasons for its decision to change leadership at SVCS – in part due to employee and student confidentiality rights. However, the Board wishes to emphasize that it is concerned first and foremost with maintaining a successful educational program for our community.

The main importance that we as a Board strive for at SVCS is to keep things compliant with the law and in the best interest of the children. While the Board cannot discuss in detail the reasons behind its decision to no longer continue Dr. Singh's at-will employment, we thank him for his service at SVCS.

The Board will continue to hold regular monthly meetings during this school year and invites members of the SVCS community to continue to attend these meetings and share their concerns. While the Board cannot necessarily respond directly to comments or take any action that is not scheduled as part of the meeting, the Board will work with SVCS staff to ensure that concerns are appropriately addressed.

The Board also looks forward to filling the current vacancy in its membership and will be soliciting candidates to serve on the Board, with a particular focus on parents and SVCS community members.

The Board very much looks forward to overseeing the ongoing growth and success of SVCS under the leadership of Dr. Brown and to the continued participation of the SVCS community in our meetings.
